Each week, I participate in virtual meetings to speak with educators from around the country about the impact of Covid-19. We talk about our children, families, faculty members and the community at large, each of us looking for reassurance regarding our path forward. We are all facing the decision of whether or not to reopen for the end of the school year, and each school has its unique set of challenges. We also all share the immediate goal of creating a meaningful routine of learning for children and families in what seems to be the new normal.

For now, there are no new updates on when our campus will reopen, and I will let you know as soon as we know. In the meantime, I draw encouragement from the words of a dear friend, Reverend Paula Lawrence-Wehmiller.
